Global outreach	The most effective way to help is financially. Wheelchairs	We have given away several hundred wheelchairs of various types, from basic models to motorized power chairs. Scholarships	We are now helping pay university tuition for about 40 young adults in developing countries. A very much appreciated and needed program.	Our continual need is to sustain this fund so that we can maintain and grow the number of students in school. We need more sponsors.
Medicine	Every year the cost of sending medicine to Malawi and Zambia is about \$7,000. This buys about \$100,000 in US wholesale value of medicine that is dispensed by clinics in Malawi and in two remote communities in Zambia.	We need to raise funds for this ongoing project that is saving the lives of many children. It is dispensed through people we know and have worked with for many years.
LifeNets Academy in Blantyre, Malawi	Our goal has been to provide a much-needed quality private education in an area where government schools are greatly lacking. The school will provide jobs and teach skills which will benefit in many ways.	A \$50,000 fund has been established for the school project to begin in early 2010. Our goal is to raise another \$100,000 for the academy to open in 2011.
