I cannot find suitable words to express my gratitude to you for what you have done. My plan for 2008 is to retire from the government and look for a better paying job. When that happens, one thing I will do, is to contribute something to LifeNets so that someone else should be assisted just as I have been. This is a promise and I will do it!"

In this past year we have expanded our scholarships to students in Zambia, Ghana, Kenya and the Philippines.

We make every effort to keep operating expenses low and dedicate 95% of every dollar donated to program activities.

Helping children, whether they be orphans, street children or from dysfunctional families has also been a satisfying activity as we have seen positive outcomes in health and happiness. We buy large quantities of medicine for pennies on a dollar for our clinics in Malawi and for a community in Zambia. In this way your donation is also multiplied many times over. Our medicines continue to save the lives of many children.


