LifeNets has been on the front lines of helping with two natural disasters. In Sri Lanka, volunteers have helped build homes, provide tools for livelihood and helped in the camps for the homeless. In Houston, Texas LifeNets volunteers have helped Katrina hurricane evacuees with needed essentials. We have responded quickly and interfaced directly with those whose lives have been torn asunder. We are providing about \$75,000 in direct assistance to those suffering because of these catastrophes.



We provide for the education of about 60 university students in developing areas whose future will be determined by the higher education they receive in their own country. We maintain an agriculture and cattle development project for two communities in central Zambia. We have helped establish livelihood projects in Malawi and other places. These programs provide families with income to support themselves. We also send medicine on a regular basis to Malawi and Zambia as well as help maintain the clinics we have built.
