A team of four – Ken Zahora from Indianapolis, Dan and Cindy Harper from Cherbourg, France and Stefan Saxin from Gothenburg, Sweden will work with our street children in Vinogradov later this month. They will teach English and help with a two week summer camp program.

Rose McDowell and Judy Servidio are traveling to Kenya to visit the Kenya Girl's Scholarship Program. This is a women's team effort to support the education of young girls who would not otherwise have the opportunity to continue their education beyond the age of 13.
