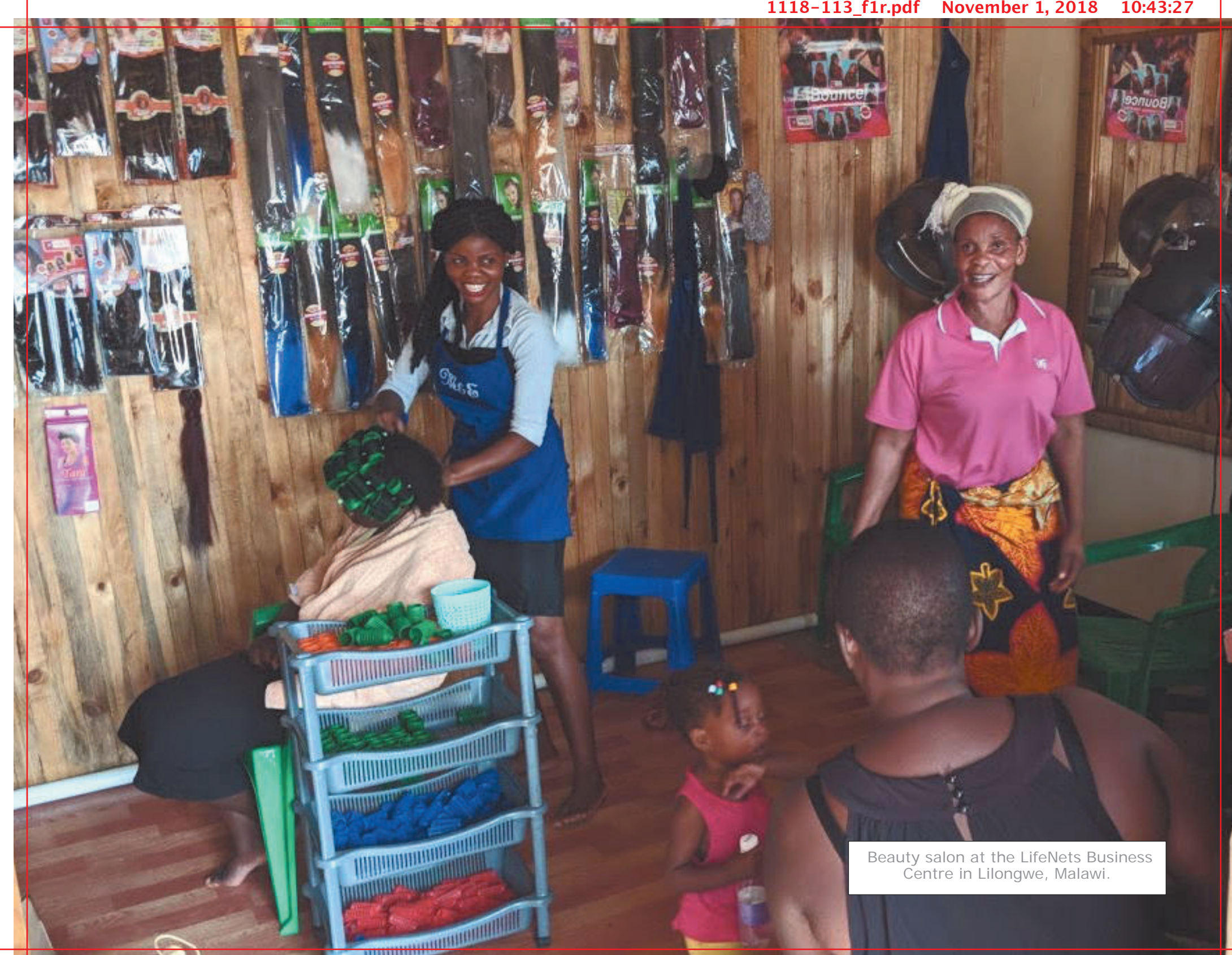

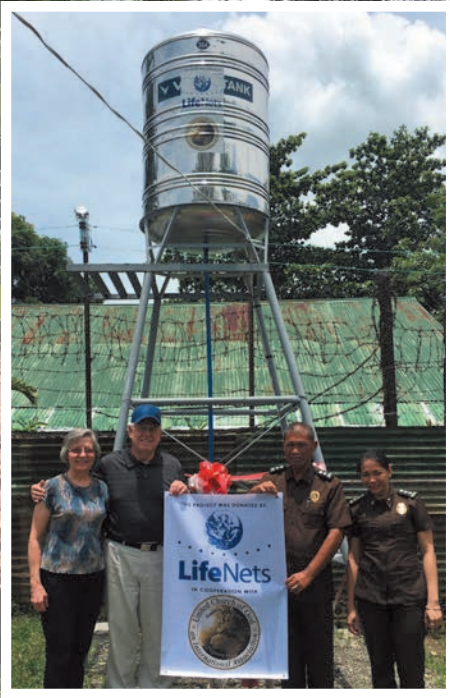

I want to share the following email of appreciation because it speaks to “why we do what we do.”

This letter comes from Jacob, a young man in Lusaka, Zambia.

Firstly I would like to thank God for His mercies and love towards us His children; despite our sins and shortcomings He still loves us unconditionally.

This reminds me of God’s promise in the book of Jeremiah: “For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, says the Lord, thoughts of peace and not of evil, to give you a future and a hope.” (Jeremiah 29:11)

It was never easy growing up for me and my siblings, having been raised by a single parent who sold tomatoes in the streets just to support her children and take them to school.

Growing up in this environment provides little or no hope at all for the future but by the grace of God I still hoped and believed that one day I will be somebody in life and take good care of my mother. Unfortunately this was not God’s plan but mine.

In the year 2010 my mother passed away when I was just a freshman in high school. I remember everything going black when I got the news that she had died, the blue and white skies all became black. I couldn’t see anything but black everything. I lost all hope, all I wanted was to take care of her in the future just as she took care of us.

At this point I didn’t know what to do or how I was going to continue with school. I almost gave up, but the church was very supportive. They encouraged me and my siblings and started helping with my school fees



up to the time I completed high school in 2012.

In the year 2015 LifeNets gave me a scholarship to go to college where I studied Accountancy and graduated in the year 2018.

Being the eighth child in a family of nine and the only graduate can only be described as a miracle.

Today I can smile having achieved one of my life-long dreams, the dream of becoming an accountant.

My gratitude goes to all those who support LifeNets. May the Almighty God bless you and your families. You are a blessing to many of us, you are a blessing to the world.
